Watertown ESPRI Survey Results

Methodology


As part of the Watertown Empire State Poverty Reduction Initiative (ESPRI), a survey was conducted April 17 through May 10, 2017. A total of 517 individuals responded, including 381 City of Watertown residents. The purpose of the survey was three-fold: (1) to engage the community-at-large (2) to ensure that people living in poverty have ample opportunity to provide input and (3) to identify barriers preventing people from moving out of poverty.

Comprised of 14 questions, the survey was made available in both electronic and paper formats. The electronic version was posted to the Watertown ESPRI website and shared with partner agencies of the United Way of NNY. A paper survey was distributed to customers of Community Action Planning Council, Watertown Urban Mission, Salvation Army, Children's Home of Jefferson County, Department of Social Services, and Jeff-Lewis Workplace.

Data Summary

52% of respondents indicated one or more adult member of the household is employed. 38% of respondents indicated one or more adult member of the household is seeking employment.

A total of 34 individuals indicated "Other". The most common responses were *unable to afford* repairs and landlord issues. Other comments referenced bed bugs, utility costs, rising taxes and looking for another place to live.

A total of 19 individuals indicated "Other". The most common responses were *finding food / food pantry* and *looking for work*.

Please list any other barriers preventing people from moving out of poverty or ideas you may have for reducing poverty.

A total of 153 individuals responded, summarized as follows:

- 22% of comments pertain to jobs lack of sustainable wage jobs, need for more training, and help finding a job.
- 14% of comments pertain to housing lack of affordable housing and quality of affordable housing.
- 9% of comments pertain to education assistance achieving educational goals.
- 9% of comments pertain to benefit cliff benefits end too quickly after employment.
- 8% of comments pertain to child care affordability and availability.
- 5% of comments pertain to disability unable to work / generate income.
- 4% of comments pertain to employers lack of support / flexibility.
